ETN launches low energy Twizy vehicles

On July 17th, the rain gods granted an afternoon's respite for the launch of the Eco Travel Network (ETN) at Henderson Hall. The ETN is a not-for-profit company set up to acquire, insure, maintain and promote a fleet of low energy micro-vehicles for use by National Park visitors. Helped by a grant from the Brecon Beacons National Park Sustainable Development Fund, ETN has purchased 5 Renault Twizys that are now based at accommodation businesses in the park to hire out to their guests and other members of the public. Over 20 local businesses in the park - including the Star Inn and the Post

Office in Talybont - have also agreed to recharge visiting Twizys and extend their range.

Representatives from the Park, from Renault UK (who are also sponsoring the scheme) and interested touring businesses gathered at Henderson Hall to see and in most cases test drive a Twizy. The sun shone all afternoon, which was doubly beneficial as it meant that the Hall's PV panels could keep the Twizys topped up with electricity. Driving a Twizy along the back roads of our beautiful area is an exhilarating experience, creating no atmospheric or noise pollution. The ETN hopes to demonstrate that we can dramatically reduce our travel carbon footprint and still have fun doing it. Local business Brecon Beacons Holiday Cottages is hosting one of the Twizys, for use by visitors staying in self-catering cottages in the area (more on Page 5).

Alison Kidd and Peter Williams of Pencelli, who are founding directors of the ETN, also have a Twizy of their own that is being used for ETN promotion and for vehicle testing. This will be used later in the year to explore the use of Twizys as commuter vehicles for residents. More on this in the next issue.

Community Woodland Group for Talybont

Our landscape is filled with woodlands that play a valuable role is absorbing carbon, storing water and providing space valuable for both wildlife for people. Unfortunately, many of our native woodlands no longer benefit from the cycles of management that shaped them over the last few hundred years. Unmanaged woodlands are often too dark for woodland flowers to grow and tree growth is crowded and poor, resulting in wind-blown trees and a lack of space for the next generation of trees to germinate.

The Green Valleys has helped 5 communities in our area form and operate community woodland management groups to undertake work on local woodlands. This has proven to be a great way to improve the local environment, meet new people, learn new skills, stay active and generate a sus-

tainable local supply of woodfuel to help combat carbon emissions and rising fuel costs.

Several people within the Talybont area have approached The Green Valleys for help in setting up and operating a group, so we have arranged for an open community meeting, where all are welcome. The Green Valleys provides help in setting up a group, finding start-up grants, determining what management would benefit the woodland and full training to deliver high quality and safe management works.

The first meeting will be in the Henderson Hall on Tuesday 7th August at 7pm. I look forward to seeing you there.

'Old' bird hide moved: Llangorse Lake to Talybont Reservoir

The hide was quite challenging to move and install.

Help needed for local Scouts!

The 1st Llangynidr Scout Group is looking for adult help as a matter of urgency. The Group has three sections for boys and girls from the surrounding area, which all meet on Friday evenings in Llangynidr Village Hall for a variety of exciting and fun activities - as well as occasional weekend activities and camps. The Beaver Colony caters for 5³/₄ to 8 year-olds; the Cub Pack caters for 8 to 10¹/₂ year-olds; and the Scout Troop caters for 10¹/₂ to 14 year-olds.

Although there are lots of young people interested in taking part in Scouting activities, the Group has struggled to find enough adult help in the last few years - and the leadership teams in each section are down to the bare minimum and struggling to provide the adventurous, balanced programme of Scouting activities that they would really like to. If they don't get more

help, they may be forced to close before the autumn term. This would be a real shame, as there is clearly a demand from young people in the area for the sort of activities that Scouting provides. So if you know anyone who might like to help with running meetings on Friday evenings, to offer one-off activities (we have badges that cover most things!) or to help the current leaders with things like programme planning - please show them this article and ask them if they'd be willing to lend a hand. They don't need to have any previous Scouting experience but do need to be willing to work with other volunteers and with enthusiastic young people!

The Group is also in urgent need of volunteers to help with administration and management. We need to find a Group Scout Leader (who is the overall manager of the Group) and/or a Group Chair (who over-

sees the behind-the-scenes support) before September - and ideally a Secretary and other committee members to provide behind-the-scenes support like fundraising and occasional events. Without these important supporting roles the Group cannot legally exist, so again may be forced to close. So if you know anyone who has management experience, or perhaps past Scouting experience, and might be interested in taking on a management role in the Group - or someone who would be willing to lend a hand with fundraising or general committee support - please ask them to get in touch!

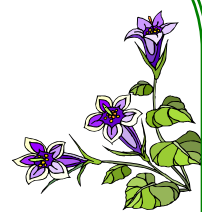

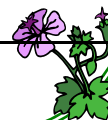
