The Great Poo Hunt!

Earlier this summer a local resident saw a Pine Marten, a very rare mammal, to the south of Talybont reservoir.

The sighting was reported to the Vincent Wildlife Trust (the same organisation that is running the local Lesser Horseshoe bat project in this area, and as featured on BBC Countryfile recently). The Vincent Wildlife Trust expert on Pine Martens co-ordinated a special search for these elusive animals on 6th August. The principal evidence sought was its 'poo', or 'scat' in the technical language of Pine Martens!

10 local volunteers including Friends of Talybont Reservoir spent the day in lovely weather walking the paths and clearings in forestry areas around the reservoir with the result that two

suspect poos were recovered.

These have now been sent for DNA analysis: the only reliable method of confirming the presence of the animal in the absence of a sighting. At the time of going to press, the lab results were still being awaited.

The Friends of the reservoir are now taking a winter break after some successful days in 2012 putting up nest boxes, litter picking and installing a new bird hide.

Your Hall, Your Community

The Henderson Hall Committee have had to make the hard choice to reinstate a charge to organised community groups for using the hall from January 2013. This will however be heavily subsidised at a 50% rate of £5/hour for adult groups and a further subsidy for youth groups of £3.75/hour. The charge for all other users is still great value for money at £10/hour.

You can rest assured that the Hall Committee stays strongly committed to all community groups and our door is always open should anyone's circumstances change and they need further

assistance in using the halls facilities. We are also committed to continued free access for some of our treasured village activities such as the monthly tea and chat for the elderly, village children's Christmas party, Annual Village Show and the Live Nativity.

There are some very big challenges ahead with some major building repairs required on the roof but the Hall Committee are dedicated in their hard work and endeavours to keep the hall in safe and good working order so that our doors stay open and the community, now and in future generations, will have a centre within

which to meet and socialise.

We are always trying to hold events that you would like to attend and would enjoy. If you give us some ideas of events that you think would be fun, we will see if we can organise them! We are already looking at some fun activities for Christmas and Spring next year. One for your diary and something we have never done before is a Big Band Night on Saturday May 18th with music and dance workshops for anyone interested during the day before the main evening event. Beautiful TALYBONT on USK is the proud home of an exciting and inspiring not-for-profit community enterprise scheme.

A 36kw hydro electric turbine, housed in the original stone-built turbine house above the dam, enables us to generate electricity which is then sold to Good Energy. The income from this power is then invested in further energy-saving and community -enhancing schemes in Talybont and the surrounding villages including Aber, Pencelli and Scethrog.

Twizy Research Trial

Have you seen the Eco Travel Network
Twizys whizzing around and wondered
if such a vehicle might work for you as
a personal or business runabout?



We are running a research trial this winter using one of the Eco Travel Network Twizys. For a participation fee of £25, individuals can use a Twizy for 3 days to carry out their normal everyday journeys - work, shopping, school run.... Participants will have to complete a research survey and short interview.

The Twizy is ultra lightweight, open-sided

and carries 2 people. It has a range of 50 miles (if driven gently) and a top speed of 50mph. A full recharge takes about 3 hrs using an ordinary 13amp socket. The Twizy will do 6-8 miles on 1 kWh of electricity. If you interested in taking part in the trial, email: alison@prospectory.co.uk or 'phone Alison & Peter on 01874 665401. Christmas Day at 10am in Llansantffraed Church


