

## Your Village Hall

The hall has been home to The Arosfa Day Centre for the last three months whilst their own building has been totally refurbished. They are due to leave at the beginning of August but a huge thank you to them for using the hall and for being so lovely.

Without this extra bit of income the hall would have had a very hard start to the year with a gas leak, meaning we had to reposition a new tank and install more pipes, a drain that needed extensive work to be connected to the soak away and a water tank that needed to be repaired.

Looking to the future, we now have to start thinking about repairing our flat roof but also have had some exciting plans drawn up for new external toilet facilities,

bike dock and bike wash area, showers and sports pavilion. This will be using as many green initiatives as possible with run-off water for the toilets and showers, along with solar thermal for heating water. We also hope to be able to install air source heating and reposition the disabled toilet in to the front porch.

Big and exciting plans that will need big amounts of money! We will be looking at ways fund all of the above and will keep you posted of the progress.



# Nightjars in the Usk Valley

The Nightjar *Caprimulgus europaeus* is a beautiful and mysterious bird, and, for those who know what to look for, can be found in clear fell areas of forestry in the Usk Valley.



It is nocturnal which makes it a lot more difficult to see. The 'churring' song of the male is all that most people get when they go to look for them. The Spanish name for Nightjar is 'Goatsucker' which refers to an old folklore that they fed from the milk of goats – the Latin for goatsucker being caprimulgus.

They are a medium sized nocturnal species (26 – 28cm in length) with long wings (57 – 64cm) with a weight of between 65 and a 100g. Their feet are very small rarely used for walking but they have long pointed wings. The plumage is cryptically coloured making them

blend in with leaves and bark. They perch along a branch as opposed to across it, which reminds me one I watched in France one time which was perched lengthways across a telephone wire in the daytime.

Late evening and the early mornings are the best time to see them. Dimly lit shapes are the usual sightings as they perform their courtship displays, with the male wing clapping. Their habitat varies from dry open coniferous woods, scrub and heath land. Their shape is similar to a small falcon.

They feed on night flying moths and large insects, and although they have a very small beak, this can be opened very wide and also has fine hairs along the upper and lower mandible which gives them more chance of catching insects.

They nest on the ground making a small scrape where two eggs are laid which are glossy-cream colours which are spotted and blotchy with yellow or dark brown mixed in. The males have white patches in their outer wings, and it is true that if you wave a white hanky it can attract the males closer as they are inquisitive that it may be a rival male. In fact I used this technique when leading guided evening bird walks to see these species a few years ago, and we had the male flying low above our heads...

It also reminds me of a funny tale of when I took a client to the Warren Forestry near Caerphilly one year. It was a lovely warm evening and we were on site at about 8.15pm waiting for the light to drop. The midges were out in force and causing a real annoyance to us. Long sleeves were not enough and as time went on we were being annoyed relentlessly as they swarmed around our heads.


Eventually drastic measures seen me with my hood up over my face, and my client had found a purple coloured carrier bag which he placed over his head with two eye holes put in place. So there I am waving two white hankies looking like a Morris dancer and the guy next to me wearing a bright purple bag on his head. At this point I notice a guy walking a small dog coming towards us along the path. He takes one look at us and quickly turns around and heads off in the opposite direction. We fell apart laughing at how we must have looked – I often wonder what he must have been thinking.


